Motorised Paddock Bikes

This has to be brought to all Team's attention right up-front...We have noticed an increase in the use of motorised transport of all types around the paddock. Personal electric scooters now make regular appearances, even personal "hoverboards".

Whilst testing, qualifying and racing is live on circuit – we ask that all riders, helpers and family members, particularly children, put these away until the close of track activity. With the vehicle movement we have around the Paddock during live times – the use of these vehicles is an accident waiting to happen.

Please respect this request.

Attendee Restrictions

Solo Teams will be issued 3x tickets as always, Sidecars 6x

Riders may stay over in the Paddock on Thursday, Friday & Saturday.

Sunday stay-over is not permitted riders must be off site by 9pm on Sunday.

Vehicle passes will not be issued or required for this meeting.

Online Booking at bemsee.net

All meeting bookings are online. This is mandatory and we will not be able to take bookings in person on the day. The online declaration has now been amended to show you understand and accept the additional risks involved relating to Covid-19 at such an event.

Payment for the Donington meeting will be taken one week from the event on Friday 26th May. Please ensure you have sufficient funds on your card to enable payment to be taken. Declined cards will mean that you'll need to give us different card details or advise your card over the phone for us to try manually. Cash payments on the day will not now be accepted, we need to remove cash handling and the risk associated with that from what we do in Race Office.

All entrants will be emailed e-tickets, 3 per solo entrant, 6 per sidecar - these must be presented on the gate to gain entry to the circuit. This covers all days.

IMPORTANT: If you develop Symptoms....

You must not attend - if you develop any symptoms of Covid-19 once you have booked the event - you are required to self-isolate under Government guidelines. Please notify Bemsee as soon as possible if this happens so we can amend your booking.

Processes & Documentation

After you've entered online – you will be emailed eTickets around 10 days from the meeting. These you can print at home or save on a mobile for presentation at the Donington main gate. A reminder, you need to present your ticket to the gate if you leave the circuit and intend to return. This is to protect everyone's security.

Payment for the meeting will be taken on Friday 26th May.

At Bemsee meetings you are required to go through Technical Inspection before attending the Race Office for sign-on.

Vehicle passes will not be issued or required for this meeting.

Observe the Paddock Plan

The Paddock 1 area is allocated to those who have booked Garage space in advance – please observe these restrictions and park accordingly, see separate Paddock Plan.

The Club has paid to provide the circuit installed electricity supply in Paddock 2 for riders' use over all three days. This is now a high additional cost to the Club. **We would ask all those who plug-in to the facilities in Paddock 2 to pay an additional £10 in the Race Office to assist us in offering this provision.** Please also observe the MSV Fair Use policy restrictions wherever you are plugging in....

MSV "FAIR USE POLICY" Electricity usage

You will see MSV signage on site regarding their "Fair Use Policy" on electricity hookups. This is in force on our Friday Testdays. Payment of fees is managed by MSV and there will be a member of staff in the Race Office area on Friday. Please check if you owe fees and see them to make payments.

Garages and Paddock Areas

Going forward, we plan to house 3 riders per single garage. Garages should remain fully open at all times to the front and rear for the duration of testing/racing and whilst people are in there working on bikes.

NOTE: - sleeping within the Garages is strictly forbidden.

Hire fees will be \pounds 20/rider for each garage – you will pay in advance online. Keys will be available from Race Office on Thursday 1st only to riders who are on the Garage List. Otherwise, keys will be available from the Race Office from Friday morning. One key holder will need to take responsibility for collecting and returning the key from each paired garage (there is a single locked door for each pair). Keys must be returned during Sunday morning back to the Race Office.

Garages will be available for advanced reservation by email to <u>mikedommett@hotmail.com</u> from 2pm on Friday 26th May - include with that info for each rider if you are booking on behalf of a group. Confirmation emails will be issued to advise the garage details - this will include links to enable you to pay for the garage individually or in groups online, **in advance of the event.**

Transponder Hire – CHANGE TO PROCEEDURE

If you are hiring a Transponder, they will be available for collection from the Race Office **from Saturday morning 3rd**. You will need to advise Technical Officials that you are hiring when you attend Inspection. These will have been charged in advance and cleaned, so they present no Covid infection risk and can be handled directly.

Some transponders have been losing charge later in recent meetings – hence Saturday collection.

Technical Inspection

All Bemsee Classes

The Technical Bay will open from 3pm on Friday 2nd June and will run to around 5.30. The Bay will re-open on Saturday at 07.30

Present with all kit on, including helmet. Clothing Inspectors will conduct a check of your kit. On completion of inspections you will be handed a Technical Inspection Card signed by the Inspectors and stickers for your helmet and bike will be applied. You will also need to sign the reverse of the card, before bringing that to Race Office for sign-on.

Sign-On

The Race Office is on the first floor of the main building over the garages – there's an access stairway between G14-15 and a one-way system at the entrance with a door in and a door out. Race Office will be open will be open for rider sign-on from 7.30 on Friday 2nd for the Testday and from 3pm same day for those who have completed Tek

Inspection to sign on for the weekend – you should attend with your completed Technical Card and your Licence. The Bemsee Race Office team will be present, and still will be working behind Perspex safety screens, to visually check licences and deal with any issues and queries. Hand sanitiser will be widely available. You will show the front & back of your Technical Card and then place it in a box in the Race Office as directed. The Race Office Team will note your attendance and mark you off on our sheets – there is no longer a requirement for you to sign the actual sign-on sheet. You will be handed a Practice Permit, take this with you on your first session – it confirms to the Collecting Area staff that you have completed the sign-on process.

You will have accepted the ACU revised declaration regarding the Risks of Motorsport both online when you confirmed your booking and by signing the same declaration that is on the reverse of your Technical Inspection Card.

If the Race Office is closed - Assistance if required is available via the Club's main number 01708 720305, voice messages can be left and these are received by email by our staff and we will call back as soon as possible.

Access to Race Control in the main building will be restricted to essential staff only or by arrangement with the Race Office.

Be Prepared if you attend the Friday Testday – 98db Drive-By Day

As is usual at Bemsee Testdays, we expect you to ensure your bike and kit is fit for purpose. Your bike will need a compliant number on it, we are running the whole event under an ACU Permit, so that is a requirement. There is no separate technical inspection on Friday for the Testday itself – apart from noise testing....

Noise Levels

Please ensure that your machine complies with the current ACU **noise limit of 105dba static.**

On Friday Testday, you are required to present your machine for Testing as you go through the Collecting Area at the Melbourne Loop access. You can attend your first session early to get tested. On Friday this is conducted by our Technical Officials. Random noise tests will be conducted by Bemsee Technical Officials and drive-by monitoring takes place continuously on all days.

Restrictions on a 98db Drive-By day

This is the third restricted day of its type the Club has done. The Club is required by its contract with the circuit to monitor and enforce restrictions as follows...

Race Control will continuously monitor the drive-by readings of bikes. Any that are identified as exceeding 98db drive-by will see a Black Flag with their number in the headon at the Esses, repeated at the beginning of the start-finish straight. Riders are expected to leave the circuit at the pit-lane. Technical Officials will be present to check your bike.

Riders are expected to use baffles in their exhausts where available, initial noise testing will note if these have been fitted. *If removed and the bike then fails noise readings whilst on circuit – the rider will be suspended from testing for the rest of the day.*

If a rider having been shown the Black Flag, ignores it and continues on track – <u>on the</u> <u>completion of their session, they will be suspended from testing for the rest of the day.</u>

If a rider is Black-Flagged for a second time during the day, <u>that will also mean they are</u> <u>suspended from testing for the rest of the day.</u>

Riders need to take these restrictions seriously, the Club is required to enforce all noise restrictions on a 98db day.

Engine Start Times

Please respect the following: **Friday & Both Race days** - **no earlier than 08.45am.** No engines to be run **after 18.45**.

Access on to the Circuit

Listen to Tannoy announcements or use your Mobile to run the Mixlr app and listen to announcements that way (Search for Bemsee Paddock Tannoy once the app is loaded and open – turn your sound up)

Collecting Area is located at the Melbourne Loop (see Paddock Plan). Please ensure you attend in good time for your practice session/race. Don't forget your practice pass on both days – you will be required to show the pass at the Collecting Area entrance. Late comers' risk being excluded from races. Please listen out for paddock announcements, but be aware of when you are due out, irrespective of whether you have heard a call or not.

Exit from the Circuit

Riders should leave the circuit at the outside of the circuit prior to Redgate Bend as directed by the flag off marshals. <u>Approach this sector with due respect for the marshals.</u>

On-Track Protocol

All the usual flag signals will apply.

If you fall and are Ok – please try to give a thumbs up to marshals on that sector. Please keep your helmet on and visor down until you are on the safe side of the armco barrier. Recovery units will return your bike to the paddock from the circuit, you may travel with your bike onboard – you may be transported off the circuit by other means. Please follow the instructions given to you by the Marshals and Recovery Crews.

Drafting the Pitwall

Some riders feel there is an advantage to be gained by drafting along the pit wall. There is nothing to stop you doing this in theory, but please be aware - and make an allowance on your line - for pit boards being hung out from the pit wall during the session.

Medical Assistance

If you require to attend Medical Center, our teams will arrange for you to be taken there safely. Be advised that your helpers should not attempt to attend the Medical Center to see how you are, they will be refused entry. They should visit Race Office or contact our office line on 01708 720305 for an update on your circumstances.

Practice starts

...will not be possible at this circuit as the flag off point is soon after the chequered flag point.

Split Starts & Combined Grids

The following classes are involved in Split-Starts:

Rookie 600 – Rookie 1000 >>> R1000 will be the first pod, all races

250 MZ – Blue Haze GPF >>> GPF will be the first pod, all races

F400 – Blue Haze GP >>> >> The grid will all go together, gridded according to gual/fastest race lap in previous session

Thunderbike Ultra – Thunderbike Extreme >>> The grid will all go together, gridded according to qual/fastest race lap in previous session

Once the grid is assembled all riders will proceed on a warm up lap, indicated by the waving of a green flag from the startline gantry.

On re-assembly back onto the grid – a flag marshal will be positioned in the grid between the two pods. The first start will go on the lights. The second pod will remain in their positions for a period (10-20 secs) and then the second pod will start **also on the lights.**

Trophies & Awards

We plan to run our Saturday evening Prize-Giving. This will be either in the Garage 39 Cafe approx. 45 minutes after racing has finished or if the weather is good enough we will hold the presentations outside by the podium near the tek bay. In 2022 all podium finishers in main and sub-classes will receive the new Gold-Silver-Bronze Medals and the wide range of spot-prizes will also be awarded during the evening.

Please attend if you can and support your Class.

All podium finishers should collect Medals from the Race Office on Sunday.

Results

Printed results are currently not being made available. Results and grid sheets are posted on the wall of the race office for viewing. You can also access both live timing and all the results and grids from TSL Timing.com

Speed Limits in the Paddock

There is a strict **10MPH SPEED LIMIT** on the infield and in the paddock. A speed control point will monitor riders and breach of this limit may result in exclusion.

In the Paddock

Motorised Paddock Bikes are prohibited as are trailing electrical leads without wedge protectors.

Generators with consideration to your fellow riders, please shut down petrol driven generators in the paddock by **11.30pm** Please avoid starting them earlier than **8am**.

Children are welcome at Bemsee meetings but must remain under supervision at all times. The paddock is a dangerous place for a wandering child. Know where they are and what they're doing. U-16's are prohibited as spectators in the pit lane – we further request that Children do not ride pushbikes whilst racing is running and there is race bike traffic moving in the paddocks.

Disposal of Tyres, Oil & Fuel Cans

Circuits now require riders to remove used tyres from the circuit themselves. Please do not leave them in the paddock, garages or in the rubbish bins. Circuits are charged for disposal of tyres and if tyres are just left then Club's do risk having charges passed on. This also applies to oil and fuel drums.

Hazardous Waste Materials must be removed from the site or disposed of correctly, this includes Toilet waste – this should not be disposed of in the public toilets. See the Fuel Station for the location of waste disposal points. There are Oil disposal drums on site for waste oil, please do not contaminate with other oil/solvents or cooking fat.

Oil Spillages in the Paddock

Any spills must be reported to Paddock services at the earliest opportunity for treatment - any damage will be recharged to the club/team.

No Pegging or Drilling into the tarmac paddock surface...or you will be charged for repairs.

General Conduct

Riders are reminded that they are responsible for their own conduct and that of their friends, family & supporters. In the same way that you would observe instructions & requests from Marshals & Officials, we expect the same of your entourage. Examples of abuse have occurred in the past where Officials have requested people to move from restricted areas. A reminder then that abusive or aggressive conduct towards our volunteers will not be tolerated and risks the exclusion of the rider with whom any offending person is associated.

Fire Extinguishers

All riders are reminded they should have access to a 2kg dry powder extinguisher, the Club will conduct spot-checks each day.

Any that are identified as exceeding 98db drive-by will see a Black Flag with their number in the head-on at the Esses, repeated at the beginning of the startfinish straight. Riders are expected to leave the circuit at the pit-lane. Technical Officials will be present to check your bike.

Baffles. Riders are expected to use baffles in their exhausts where available, initial noise testing will note if these have been fitted....

If removed after noise testing and the bike then fails noise readings whilst on circuit – the rider will be suspended from testing for the rest of the day.

Black Flags. If a rider having been shown the Black Flag, ignores it and continues on track...

<u>On the completion of their session, they will be suspended from</u> <u>testing for the rest of the day.</u>

2-Strikes. If a rider is Black-Flagged for a second time during the day....

they are suspended from testing for the rest of the day.

Yes, it is strict, it's all part of our agreement with the Circuit. Riders need to take these restrictions seriously, the Club is required to enforce all noise restrictions on a 98db day.

DOUBLE WAVED YELLOW FLAGS



This is an important Bulletin for all competitors who intend to race with BMCRC now or in the future. Please ensure you read and understand it.

From Round 3 of the 2023 BMCRC/MRO Championships at Snetterton 300, we will be introducing a new flag protocol to further improve safety after an incident occurs. Marshals may now display 2 yellow flags, simultaneously waved at a flag post.

The meaning of this is simple; **Double Waved Yellow (two flags)** - Great Danger. There is definitely a significant obstruction of the course or other major issue ahead.

SLOW DOWN SIGNIFICANTLY and BE PREPARED TO STOP.

The obstruction could be a person, a machine or something else. It might mean that competitors(s), marshal(s) and/or bike(s) are on the track surface.

The meaning of the other yellow flag combinations remains unchanged: **Stationary Yellow** - Incident ahead. No overtaking from the point of the flag. Decrease your speed and be aware of other competitors.

Waved Yellow (single flag) - Incident in this sector. No overtaking. Decrease your speed and be wary of blind corners or crests. Importantly, competitors or marshals could be in the course if the incident has just occurred. Be prepared to stop.


After an incident, you may only begin to race again (i.e. overtake) after you pass (i.e. at the point of) the green flag (or lights).

We have introduced this new protocol as it is now used at FIM events, BSB and other national level events as well as by car racing. It allows the marshals to signal to you an even higher degree of danger than the single waved yellow flags.

This is being introduced to further improve your safety as competitors and also that of the volunteer marshals.

Anyone not respecting the flags and riding inappropriately will receive significant sanctions from the Clerk of the Course.
